

JUNE 30 SHORE VIEWS (8:00 PM - SUNSET) (ADULTS AND CHILDREN 8 YRS. OR OLDER WITH ADULTS)

Begin the fifth year of *Reading the Landscape* with a late evening boat trip along the easternmost coast of Keweenaw. Come with family or friends to hear about the Keweenaw shore with limnologist Judith Budd. **MEET** in Copper Harbor at the Isle Royale Queen IV boat dock.

JULY 7 COASTAL GEOLOGY

(9:30 AM - 2:30 PM) (ADULTS)

Visit Horseshoe Harbor with geologist Bill Rose and artist Kayo Miwa to discover the diverse and unique qualities of rock beaches in Keweenaw. A great place to find stromatolites. **MEET** at the end of US 41, 2 miles east of Copper Harbor.

JULY 14 LAKE EFFECT (12:00 PM - 4:30 PM) (ADULTS)

Spend the day along the Keweenaw coast at Great Sand Bay learning about weather and weather events with meteorologist Karl Bohnak. Gather the wind and clouds onto paper with artist Linden Dahlstrom. **MEET** at the Eagle Harbor Community Building.

JULY 21 BETE GRISE BEACHES (9:30 AM - 2:30 PM) (ADULTS)

Visit Bete Grise beaches with educators Jim and Judy St. Arnold, and writer and teacher Peter Blau to gain an Ojibwe perspective on both historical and current use of natural resources along the shore. **MEET** at the Bete Grise Preserve near Pt. Isabelle on the Gay-Lac La Belle Road (6 miles from Lac La Belle and 15 miles from Gay).

JULY 28 SAND AND PEBBLES (9:30 AM - 2:30 PM) (ADULTS AND CHILDREN 8 YRS. OR OLDER WITH ADULTS)

Enjoy a day at the beach and gain new perspectives on the sand and pebbles beneath your feet with environmental educator Brian Rajdl and artist Linden Dahlstrom. **MEET** 4.8 miles west of Eagle River where the Sunset Bay Road runs off the 5-Mile Point Road.

AUG. 4 HARBOR SHORES (9:30 AM - 2:30 PM) (ADULTS)

Hike the shoreline of Eagle Harbor Bay to uncover its social and geologic history. Historian Marcia Mason, geologist Bill Rose, and artist Randy Wakeham will help you understand and interpret the colorful past of this harbor. **MEET** at the Eagle Harbor lighthouse main parking area.

AUG. 11 LAKE'S EDGE (9:30 AM - 2:30 PM)

(ADULTS AND CHILDREN 8 YRS. OR OLDER WITH ADULTS)

Explore the edge of Lake Superior and Gratiot Lake with environmental educator Bonnie Hay and artist Kayo Miwa. Broaden your perceptions about creatures of the sky, of the woods, and of the coastal waters. **MEET** at Brunette Park on the Gay-Lac La Belle Road (10 miles from Lac La Belle and 11 miles from Gay).
